This News Letter is to give you brief details of the damage to our fisheries and with the season approaching asking you to take care as after the recent unprecedented floods banks may be undercut, pools may have changed dramatically so take great care when you are wading on all our waters.

Due to recent flooding the Mardy farm out of all our fisheries has suffered a large amount of damage. The damage to the fields has been considerable but so has the damage to the homes on both Mardy farm and Pyscodlyn.

There has been a large erosion on the river bank near the Mardy farm and the farmer is carrying out work to rectify this. It should not take long to carry out the work and we ask our members to keep away from this area due to the large machinery working to carry out the repairs. Please access the beat for the time being from Llanwenarth church end.

The Kemys and Ysbyty have suffered some minor bank damage but be aware there may be undercut banking that we have not at present been able to find. The fencing on the Ysbyty has been badly affected we will look to see what we can do to reinstate this where it is necessary.
